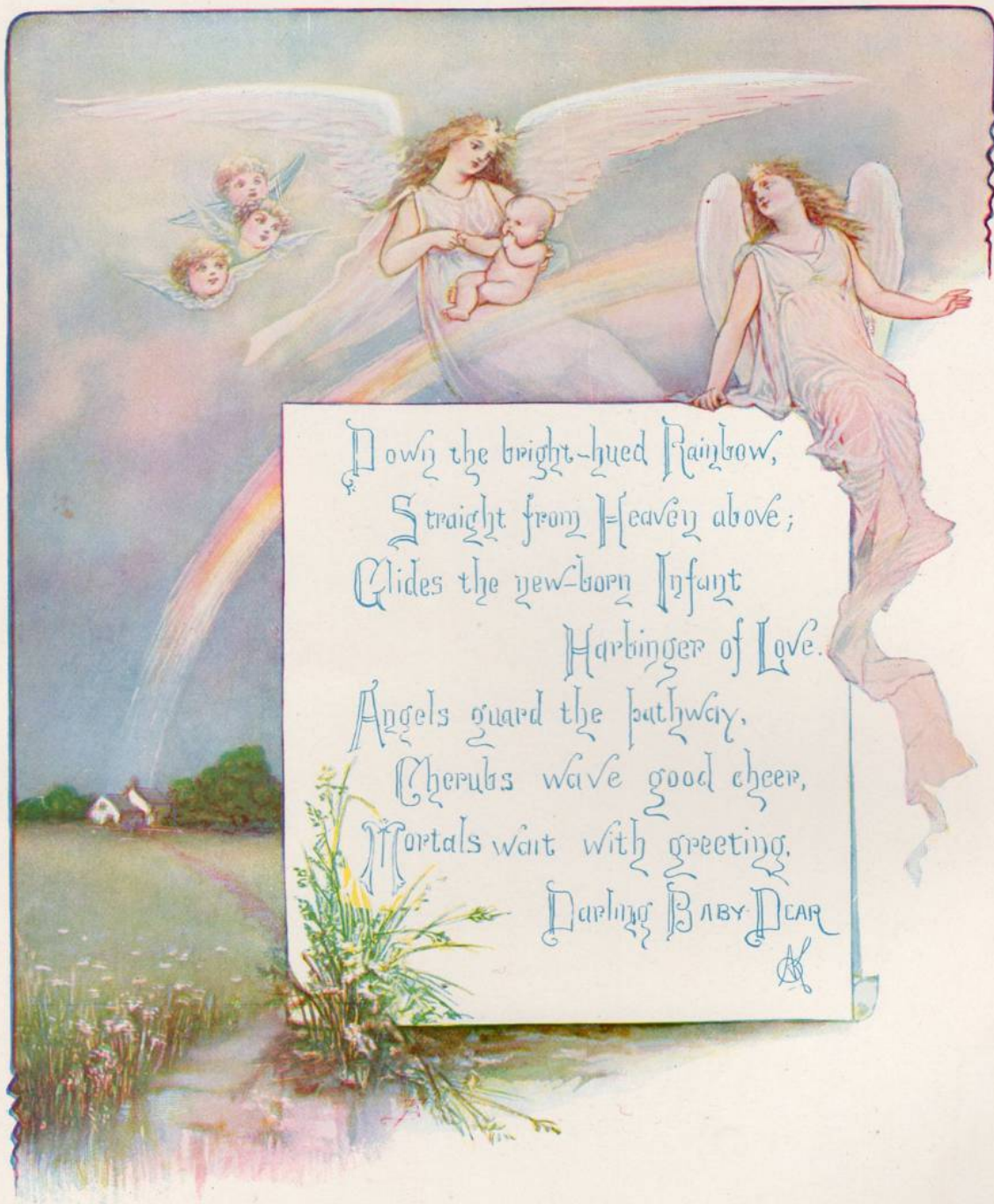

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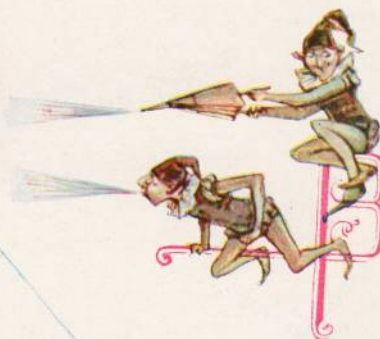

old. She enjoyed it & tried to catch the bubbles
while her Papa held her.

Her Papa bought her buggy for her when she was
about 2 months old.

Grandfather Crawford bought a pretty oak high
chair for her when she was 8 months old.

When she was about 10 months she rode on
Grandfather Crawford's shoulders while he sat in Papa's
big arm chair. She enjoyed this so much & often went to
sleep while up there. She learned to clutch & pull his
hair to make him keep on rocking. The first winter

VOCATION IN LIFE BEST ADAPTED FOR

REMARKS: Phrenology is a science which deals with mental phenomena and reveals character like an open book. It classifies the mind into "faculties," which are located and designated as in diagram. These faculties are not manifested by "bumps on the head," as many appear to understand, but by cranial contour and development as a whole. Measurements are taken from the opening of the ear upward, forward, backward and diametrically; also around the crown of the head. Size generally indicates power; but quality, temperament, and inherited constitution are dominating factors. A correct Phrenological Chart shows a person's disposition, tastes, temper, sentiments, domestic attachments, religious and moral tendency, judgment, talent for

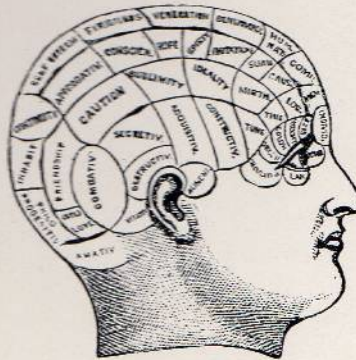


DIAGRAM OF FACULTIES

business, literature, etc., and is in short a mirror of the mind. Readings can be taken at a very early age (six years is young enough, however), and Phrenologists are frequently able to call attention to latent mental influences in advance of their natural manifestation, affording parents the opportunity—by timely teaching and training—to encourage the good or suppress the bad. Charts also indicate what vocation the child is best adapted for, so that a natural born tradesman may avoid failure in life by being arbitrarily educated, say for the ministry, or one who could by proper "coaching" acquire fame as a statesman may not be made a mental "misfit" by being brought up to some occupation ungenial to his taste.
